Greetings Friends,

We are thankful for the financial support and accomplishments in 2020. The past year was challenging, but also filled with new opportunities. GHA was fortunate to have 140 volunteers serving over 900 volunteer hours to assist our mission. As we switched to a virtual and hybrid world GHA provided 40 educational activities, with 65 days of events, 25 were held virtually. Some highlights are listed below.

GHA kicked off the year with the annual Winter Membership Meeting on February 2. Members gathered for an update on GHA, latest treatment options, and connection. We ended the afternoon with a game of bowling.



To increase awareness and diagnosis to women with bleeding disorders, GHA attended a 3 day Working Women's Survival Show with over 10,000 attendees.

GHA members and staff advocated both on a state and federal level. On a federal level members assisted in passing H.R. 5952, the Hemophilia SNF Access Act. We continued to bring awareness for bleeding disorders on a state level and knowledge to our elected officials regarding the harm when co pays don't count.

GHA held 3 fundraisers, 1 Give Back event, and 2 membership meetings. In addition, the Family Education Weekend offered over 13 sessions in a hybrid format. GHA's Helping Hands financial assistance program assisted 10 families with financial support.



**Camp Notaclotamongus** hosted a virtual camp that included siblings. We sent over 65 virtual camp kits to attendees. Campers had the opportunity to reconnect with friends and participate in a variety of traditional camp activities.

There are several ways to get involved. You can attend our many educational programs, volunteer at our events, or give back through donations, many companies have matching contributions. Our women, men and teen groups provide opportunities to make connections with others who are also navigating life with a bleeding disorder.

GHA is a community of sharing, whether it's providing help when you or your bleeding disorder's family is in need, or you are helping others in need. GHA is here to serve you, this is a community organization. We hope you will build a strong bond among those coping with a bleeding disorder.
