We are thankful for the financial support and accomplishments in 2021. During two years of navigating Covid-19, GHA continued to research best practices and opportunities to gather as a community and to provide the most relevant and effective resources. We were able to meet more in person, but still offered virtual programming. GHA was fortunate to have 107 volunteers serving over 850 volunteer hours to assist our mission. Some highlights are listed below.

GHA kicked off the year with the annual Spring Membership Meeting in April outdoors at Camp Wyman. Members gathered for an update on GHA, latest treatment options, and connection.



GHA members and staff advocated both on a state and federal level. Members brought awareness to our elected members of the harmful effects of accumulator adjustors.



GHA held 4 fundraisers, 2 membership meetings and the Family Education Weekend, which offered over 11 educational sessions. GHA’s Helping Hands financial assistance program assisted 13 families with financial support.



Camp Notaclotamongus hosted a virtual camp that included siblings. We sent virtual camp kits to attendees. Campers had the opportunity to reconnect with friends and participate in a variety of traditional camp activities.

Our women, men and teen groups provide opportunities to make connections with others who are also navigating life with a bleeding disorder.
